Safe Sex is the new black.

Safe sex looks good on everyone. So grab a condom!

That condom looks great on you.

When used correctly and consistently, latex condoms are highly effective at preventing transmission of HIV and other sexually transmitted diseases.

Oral sex is safer sex.

Oral sex is a low-risk sexual activity. While it is not risk free, oral sex has a significantly low risk of HIV transmission and the few documented cases involved blood and cuts in the mouth.

My partner knows my HIV status.

Sometimes talking about sex isn't as easy as having it. But talking to your partner about your HIV status is one of the best ways to keep you both safe, healthy, and happy.

HIV only needs one chance.

HIV can be transmitted even through only one needle sharing or unprotected sexual experience. Always practice safe sex, and never share needles or works.
