What is it?

A research study to learn more about how providing housing to people can have an impact on their health and the prevention of HIV.

Who is it for?

Anyone who is:

- At least 18 years old, **and**
- Low income, **and**
- HIV +, **and**
- Currently homeless or at risk of losing housing, **and**
- Able to complete an interview in English or Spanish.

Why should I participate?

Everyone in the study will:

- Receive information that can improve their health.
- Receive assistance with housing needs and private health discussions with a counselor.
- Be paid for their time and travel.

Give us important information that can help improve the health of other people living with HIV.
