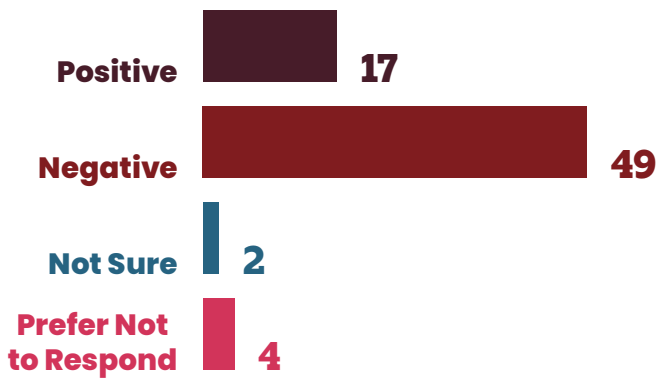


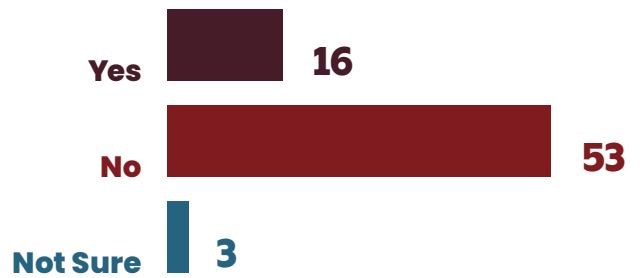

Demographics | 72 Respondents

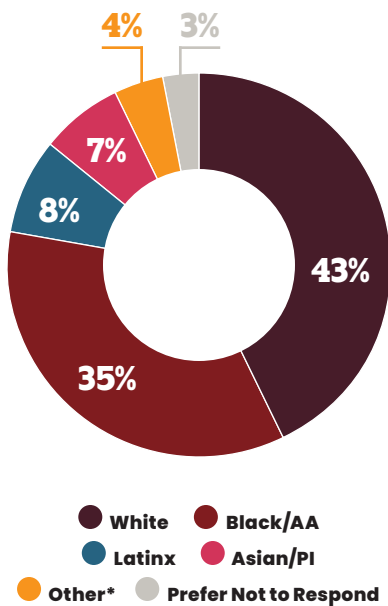
HIV Status



Have You Ever Received Supports for Housing/Homelessness?

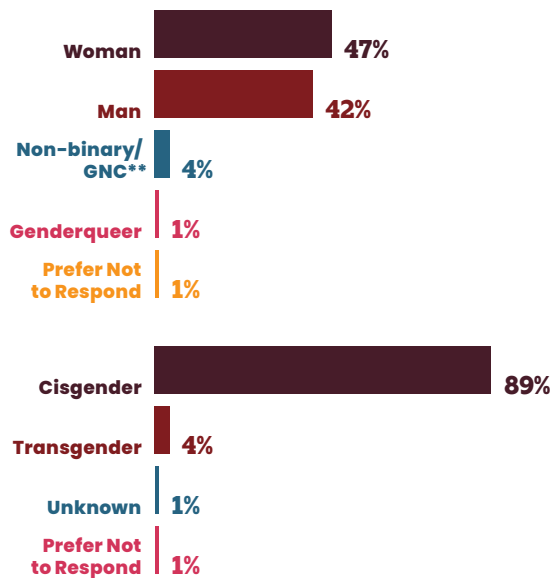


Race & Ethnicity



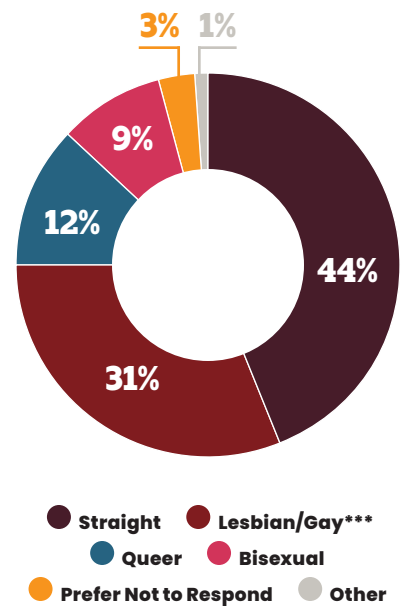

Survey Results

What are the top 3 challenges that people experiencing homelessness/housing instability face in achieving their best health?

1. Housing availability, affordability, accessibility | **61**
2. Economic stability (for example, access to jobs, job training, etc.) | **40**
3. Lack of access to mental health and psychiatry services | **28**

What are the top 3 things getting in the way of people accessing and maintaining stable housing?

1. Housing availability, affordability, accessibility | **52**
2. Economic stability | **36**
3. Undesirable affordable housing options | **30**

What are the top 3 solution(s) you would want to see implemented to help people experiencing housing instability/homelessness?

1. Removing extensive financial barriers to renting | **38**
2. Prioritizing Home IL Plan | **35**
3. Increasing funding from all levels of government | **31**

What are the most important policy issues that you believe CHH's policy and advocacy work should focus on in 2024 and 2025? (Respondents were asked to select up to 3 options).

1. Increasing funding for permanent supportive housing | **44**
2. Increase affordable housing units | **40**
3. Elevating housing as the primary social determinant of health | **30**
