The **AIDS Foundation Chicago (AFC)** is seeking reviewers to help select grantees to provide services under the Ryan White Treatment Modernization Act. In order to make grant awards for community organizations AFC uses a competitive review process. During the review process, experts in the fields of social services, HIV services, community development, and individuals with lived experience from vulnerable populations, are asked to read and evaluate applications based on program criteria.

Reviewers will read and score applications starting *January 26 through February 3, 2026* and submit reviews electronically by 5 pm February 3, 2026.

Reviewers will participate in remote review panel sessions, starting *February 4-5, 2026*.

AFC expects to announce funding awards on February 9, 2026

Have experience with HIV/AIDS prevention and/care provision?

Have experience as a consumer of HIV/AIDS services,?

Have an interest in policymaking or HIV service advocacy?

AFC seeks individuals with:

Ability to understand public health delivery program design concepts

Familiarity with HIV/AIDS service provision, epidemiology, or other communicable disease methodology

Ability to succinctly summarize complex information in writing and through oral presentation

Ability to identify and present key concepts efficiently and clearly

Ability to conduct impartial and confidential reviews of proposals submitted by applicants

Proficiency in the use of email, online, web-based interaction

Ability to participate in review meetings

Review Panelist Expectations

Time Commitment: each panelists will receive between 2-3 proposal documents to review over a 7 day period.

Maintain Confidentiality: it is expected that the names of applicants, their proposed strategies and fiscal operations are to be kept confidential by panelists during all aspects of the granting and review process.

Conflict of Interest: panelists cannot review proposal applications from agencies for which they are employed, have ownership interest, participate as board members, or volunteers. Panelists with employment, interest ownership or board membership may be assigned to review panels in which their agency is not applying or currently providing service.
