Budget Line-Item Index

African American HIV/AIDS Response Fund

This state program is administered with federal funds and goes directly to Black-led community-based organizations. This funding was appropriated from federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds. The initial appropriation of \$15M was included in the state's FY22 budget.

Getting to Zero (GTZ-IL) Initiative

This State GRF funded line-item is flexible and for FY24, was intended for an at-home HIV testing kit pilot program, HIV-related stigma reduction programs, housing for formerly homeless and unstably housed people living with HIV, increased access to PrEP, and HIV awareness and education across the state.

HIV Lump Sum

This State GRF funded line-item is used for expenses of AIDS/HIV Education, Services, Prescription Drugs, Correctional Facilities Counseling, Referral and Partner Notification (CTRPN), and Patient and Worker Notification.

Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) Program and Expenses

This State GRF funded line-item is used for project-based rental units (i.e. project-based housing assistance) for people living with HIV.

PrEP Medication Assistance

This State GRF funded line-item supports the IDPH program for uninsured and underinsured populations. PrEP4Illinois offers client navigation for PrEP services through education, medication access, referrals to PrEP-friendly clinicians, and enrollment navigation into payment assistance programs.

Programs for Prevention of HIV/AIDS

Federal funds from the CDC support grants for health departments to implement high-impact HIV prevention programs.

Quality of Life

This State GRF funded line-item support grants awarded to smaller community-based organizations. These grants are funded from the Red Ribbon HIV Lottery Scratch Off tickets.

Ryan White Comprehensive AIDS Resource Emergency Act of 1990 (CARE)

Federal funds from HRSA support the State's AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP) for HIV medication, dispensing, and other program costs.

STI Screening and Treatment Services

This State GRF funded line-item support expenses and programs related to prevention, screening, and treatment services to address Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) cases.

Surveillance Programs and Seroprevalence Studies of HIV/AIDS

Federal funds from the CDC that support surveillance projects to prevent new transmissions, monitor HIV trends, and conduct seroprevalence studies to address health inequities.

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
